

1		Cucumber - Boston Pickling (<i>Cucumis sativus</i>)	The Boston Pickling Cucumber is an heirloom variety. Vigorous vines give large yields of smooth green fruit. It is excellent for pickles--very crisp and good quality. Great for salads too.	5-8 ft vines	2-6 inches	55
2		Cucumber - Muncher (<i>Cucumis sativus</i>)	The Muncher Cucumber is a prolific, burpless, and nearly spineless, medium-green variety renowned for its sweet, crisp flavor and thin skin. Best harvested at 6–9 inches long, these versatile cucumbers are ideal for fresh snacking, salads, and pickling. They are disease-resistant, heat-tolerant, and grow on vigorous, easy-to-grow vines	3-5 ft vines	6-9 inches	55-65
3		Cucumber - Richmond Green Apple (<i>Cucumis sativus</i>)	HEIRLOOM Richmond Green Apple Cucumber is a unique heirloom prized for its round, apple-shaped fruits and refreshing, mildly sweet flavor. Unlike standard slicing cucumbers, this variety remains firm and flavorful even when picked slightly larger, offering excellent versatility for fresh eating, salads, and pickling. A strong, vining grower that thrives in warm weather.	4-6 ft vines	2-4 inches diameter	60-75
4		Eggplant - Japanese Money Maker <i>Solanum melongena</i> 'Money Maker'	Hybrid. Money Maker is one of the most popular eggplant varieties in Japan. The semi-upright plant produces many glossy, black, oval-shaped fruit with purple calyces. The fruit is supremely tender, grows up to 5 inches long. 5		Eggplant - Listada de Gandia <i>Solanum melongena</i> 'Listada de Gandia'	Stunning magenta-striped Italian eggplant. Very productive plants produce tender, delicious fruits with unusually thin skin. Egg-shaped petite fruits fit in the palm of your hand. Holds its color even at large sizes. Fruit size 3-5 inches.	1.5 - 3 ft	3-5 inches	85
6		Gourd - Giant Birdhouse Giant <i>Lagenaria siceraria</i>	These seafoam-green, hourglass-shaped heirlooms make adorable birdhouses! When the season is over, leave the gourd to dry to a golden color. Gourds can last for years after being dried and cured. Requires a long, warm growing season.	15-35 ft vines	10-15 inches tall 8-12 inches wide	110-180 (dried)
7		Gourd (Squash) - Cucuzzi Serpente di Sicilia <i>Lagenaria siceraria</i>	Technically a gourd but also a squash that is light green, with white flesh. Use when it is young, before it develops a hard shell - commonly used in Italian dishes. Harvest when they are 6-8 inches while they are still tender. Or, grow them as big as you can, for gourds. Being a true gourd, the vines flower at night with beautiful white blooms that are moth pollinated.	3-4 ft	3 ft 2-3 inch diameter	55 days - Squash or 100 days Gourd
8		Squash - Honey Boat <i>(Cucurbita pepo)</i>	HEIRLOOM - Winter Squash A winter squash known as one of the sweetest varieties, featuring copper-tan skin with green stripes and deep orange flesh.	9-12 ft vines	6-8 inches long	90-105
9		Squash - Honeynut <i>(Cucurbita moschata)</i>	HEIRLOOM - Winter Squash A mini butternut squash just 4-5 inches long with excellent flavor and texture. Thin skin signals ripeness by turning from green to terracotta.	4-8 ft vines	4-6 inches long	100
10		Squash - Straightneck Yellow Summer Squash <i>(Cucurbita pepo)</i>	HEIRLOOM - Summer Squash Yellow Straightneck squash has thin glossy skin which can vary from a light butter yellow to a bright lemon yellow.	2-3 ft vine	4-6 inches	40-60

11		Squash - Tromboncino/ Rampicante (<i>Cucurbita moschata</i>)	HEIRLOOM - Summer AND Winter Squash The famous Italian heirloom vining zucchini with long slender 15-inch fruit has a fat bulb at the bottom. Can be grown as a summer squash when harvested early as a green color - very tender, mild, and sweet tasting. This squash is also great as winter squash leaving it on the vine harvest at golden color. <i>The solid tough vines are resistant to the squash vine borer.</i>	15-20 ft vines	15 inches long	Summer Squash: 60-70 Winter Squash: 90-100
12		Sweet Potato Rooted Slips - Stokes Purple (<i>Ipomoea batatas</i>)	Stokes Purple® sweet potatoes are dense (drier texture), mildly sweet are ideal for baking, roasting, mashing, or even adding a pop of color to your favorite desserts. This purple sweet potato contains anthocyanin antioxidants (just like blueberries) and is a good source of vitamin C and fiber. Plant outdoors once the soil is warm and all danger of frost has passed – recommend to wait until after May 1st. Plant them 12-18 inches apart in sandy, well-draining soil, burying them deeply up to the top leaves. Plant 3-5 slips per 20-gallon container.	8-10 ft vines	6-8 inch long	120-150
13		Watermelon - Royal Golden (<i>Citrullus lanatus</i>)	The most beautiful watermelon! The rind of this heirloom turns brilliant golden-yellow when ripe. The distinctive color makes it a snap to know when to harvest, and it is so beautiful in your garden. The tasty pinkish-red flesh is super sweet, crisp, and refreshing. Fruit weighing 8 to 25 lbs	4-7 ft vines	8-25 lbs	80-90
